## Message from Alistair-

There was an article in *The Guardian* a little while ago saying that there has been an "explosion" in anxiety in Britain over the past decade. Research has shown that the financial crash, austerity, Brexit, climate change and social media have contributed to massive rises in the condition. It is enough to make us wonder if the Apostle Paul was out of touch with reality when he wrote, 'Do not be anxious about anything' Phil.4:6!

'Be anxious for less' would have been a sufficient challenge. Or 'Be anxious only on Tuesdays-Thursdays'. Or be anxious between 9:00am-5:00pm. But Paul doesn't seem to offer any leeway here: 'Do not be anxious about anything.'

Could you use some calm? If so, you aren't alone. Thankfully, Paul doesn't just tell us not to be anxious about anything; he also tells us how we can discover calm.

Celebrate God's goodness- 'Rejoice in the Lord always'- Phil.4:4.

**Ask** God for help- 'In every situation, by prayer and petition'- Phil.4:6.

**Leave** your concerns with him- 'With thanksgiving, present your requests to God'- Phil.4:6.

**Meditate on good things-** 'Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things'- Phil.4:8.

**C-A-L-M**. Trade your cares for calm. Then you'll discover that 'the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus'- Phil.4:7
