Message from Alistair-

I've always liked the Graham Kendrick song 'Servant King' [written in 1983- the same year we got married!]. It begins with these familiar words,

From heaven you came, helpless babe, entered our world, your glory veiled, not to be served but to serve and give your life that we might live.

This is our God, the Servant King; he calls us now to follow him, to bring our lives as a daily offering of worship to the Servant King.

Would we do what Jesus did? He swapped the glories of heaven for the grime of a stable. He exchanged the worship of angels for the company of killers. I wouldn't do that, but Jesus did.

If you knew that only a few people would care that you came, would you still come? If you knew that those you loved, would mock you, spit on you, beat you and nail you to a cross, would you still come? Jesus did. As Paul tells us, 'And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death – even death on a cross!' Phil.2:8.

The 'hands that flung stars into space, to cruel nails surrendered.' Why? Because that's what love does. It puts the beloved before itself. He loves you that much, and because he loves you, you are so precious to him.

Do you want to love others as God has loved you? Well, God invites you to come to him and drink deeply of his love for you. Ask him to fill your heart with a love worth giving.
