Message from Alistair-

C S Lewis is always very quotable! Here is what he said about humility- 'Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less.'

Paul put it like this in his Letter to the Philippians, 'Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves' Phil.2:3. The words 'value others above yourselves' imply making a conscious judgement resting on carefully considered facts. However, Paul cannot mean [for example] that expert musicians should consider struggling learners better at music than themselves. But he does mean that they should not consider themselves as qualified to receive preferential treatment over and against learners, or as being better or more important people than them. Instead, they should treat them with appropriate respect and love.

Jesus is our example. Content to be known as a carpenter, happy to be mistaken for the gardener, he served his followers by washing their feet. If Jesus is so willing to honour us, can we not do the same for others? Can we not 'in humility value others above ourselves'?

The truly humble person submits to Christ. He or she is content to be a servant and to use what they are and have for the glory of God and the good of others. Here's a challenging prayer of the great 18th century evangelist George Whitfield-

'Let my name be forgotten, let me be trodden under the feet of all people, if Jesus may therefore be glorified.'

There is space for wheelchairs in the church at Union Street as follows:

• At the rear of the sanctuary in the slight recess adjacent to the fire door on the right-hand side as viewed from the front.

Photography and GDPR- Union Street has advised us that they have quite a carefully worked out position for photography that includes their own folk, several of whom, for various reasons have not consented for photographs to be taken. At the same time, they want to allow for photos to be taken of the Baptism itself.

They say, 'For good reason, it's not appropriate to have people moving around, but if we would like to appoint a photographer, they could, if they wished, use the balcony as a good vantage point for photos, or take a position close to the Baptistery. Whilst 'backs of heads' are okay, no photos including faces of USBC folk can be used online, shared via social media, or published without their prior consent.'
