Message from Alistair-

There's on old saying that reminds us that time flies when you're having fun! But what about in times of difficulty, heartache and suffering? Perhaps we find ourselves thinking, 'I don't know how much longer I can go on.'

Psalm 13 [a Psalm of David] contains a recurring question, 'How long, O Lord?' David's circumstances aren't described in the Psalm, but clearly he feels forgotten and forsaken. And that sentiment is shared by many of God's people throughout scripture- and of course by many of God's people across the centuries.

Yet in David's discouragement, we discover that his perception [as is often the case with our own] does not reflect reality. And David has the spiritual maturity to acknowledge that what he *feels* is true does not align with what he *knows* is true. So he reminds himself of God's steadfast love, His salvation, and His goodness- and resolves to rejoice in these things even as he struggles and suffers- 'But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. I will sing the Lord's praise, for he has been good to me.' Psalm 13:5-6.

This is the hope-filled tension of the Christian life. We ask 'How long, O Lord? Where are you God?' even as we remind our own hearts that God hasn't stopped loving us, delivering us or working in us.

Do not believe the lie that God has abandoned you. Rest in God's comforting promise to his forgetful people: 'Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands.' Isaiah 49:15-16

Will you trust in God's faithfulness today? When you are next feeling abandoned, know that God looks at his hands, engraved with each and every one of his children's names, and says, 'You are loved! I have not forgotten you.'

Photography and GDPR- Union Street has advised us that they have quite a carefully worked out position for photography that includes their own folk, several of whom, for various reasons have not consented for photographs to be taken. At the same time, they want to allow for photos to be taken of the Baptism itself.

They say, 'For good reason, it's not appropriate to have people moving around, but if we would like to appoint a photographer, they could, if they wished, use the balcony as a good vantage point for photos, or take a position close to the Baptistery. Whilst 'backs of heads' are okay, no photos including faces of USBC folk can be used online, shared via social media, or published without their prior consent.'
