Message from Alistair-

For decades, Titanic enthusiasts have speculated about what caused the ship to sink on its maiden voyage. Was it a faulty rudder, or poor communications on board the liner, or the course taken by Captain Edward Smith before it hit the iceberg? A later study by scientists has suggested that the explanation for the disaster could be as mundane as second-rate rivets!

Jennifer Hooper McCarty and Timothy Foecke are a pair of scientists and academics who have studied the downing of the cruise liner for decades. Their work analysed 48 rivets found in the wreck of the Titanic and they believe the shipbuilders used cheaper iron to make them than was originally planned. These rivets popped under the stress caused by the ship's contact with the iceberg, resulting in the flooding of five or six watertight compartments. Had the rivets been stronger, fewer compartments would have been compromised and perhaps the mighty ship would have remained afloat for several more hours- enough time for the nearby RMS Carpathia to rescue all those on board.

It's so easy to make a ship wreck of our faith and often it begins by simply drifting away. We don't spend time alone with the Lord. It's been many weeks since we opened our Bibles. We've become increasingly casual about worshipping with God's people on a Sunday. We need to make sure the hull of our convictions can withstand the stress of any collision. How sturdy are the bolts of your belief? Reinforce them with daily Bible reading, prayer, worship and fellowship.
