Sunday 22nd December: Week 4, Mary-

Reading- Isaiah 7:14-

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

In the fourth week of Advent, we remember the faith of Mary, who when she was confronted with the great call you made on her life said, 'May your word to me be fulfilled.'

Father, please give us the courage to be a people who say 'yes' to you, at this Christmas time and in the coming year. Amen.

Reading- John 1:1-5-

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Father, on this Christmas morning, we thank you again that you keep all your promises. We thank you that you came, just like you said you would!
