Message from Alistair-

Chester Zoo is home to thousands of animals, from tall giraffes to the tiniest of insects. In fact, there are over 37,000 animals from over 500 incredible species!

And that includes birds. And you can encounter Caribbean flamingos, a colony of Humboldt penguins, and some of the largest parrots in the world. And you can read all about them- the Southern Cassowary with its muscular legs and powerful feet that have given it the reputation of being one of the most dangerous birds in the wild. Grey Crowned Cranes are every bit as regal as their name suggests and are also the national bird of Uganda. The rhinoceros hornbill, one of the largest birds found in the rainforests of South-East Asia.

What also interests me is that there are often sparrows fluttering about inside the enclosures with the other birds. Somehow they've managed to get into the enclosure, maybe through the smallest of gaps. Of course they weren't important enough to put in an enclosure for everyone to admire. They didn't qualify for an explanatory plaque. Their picture didn't appear in the zoo guidebook. Maybe many people didn't even notice them. Yet of all the birds he created, God chose the sparrow to make a crucial point on the subject of fear. Jesus said, 'Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care. And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.' Matthew 10:29-31.

How wise of our Lord to use the example of a sparrow. He could have chosen eagles, albatross, owls, or countless other birds. And yet of the world's 11,000 bird species, Jesus chose one of the most insignificant, least-noticed, ordinary birds flying around. Jesus obviously wanted to make his point clear. Those who believe and follow him mean more to the Father than anything else. If God notices every humble sparrow, where they are and what they're doing, we can be sure he knows all about us and loves us more than we can ever know.

We know that many of you were at our Special Church Meeting last Sunday when we had to make a decision about the future of Oasis. If you haven't yet heard, we are delighted to be able to share with you that the Special Church Meeting voted unanimously to proceed with the purchase of 36 Green Street (comprising Oasis and the two flats above).

We are so grateful to God for his grace, love and guidance to us throughout the journey. And as a leadership team, we also want to say how much we have appreciated the gracious and helpful way you have engaged with all the discussions around Oasis. We are very excited that this unanimous decision enables us to build upon the existing critical mission work carried out, and look to new mission initiatives in the future, knowing that our future at Oasis is now more secure.

We also want to share with you details of our Pledge Sunday which will be this Sunday- 19th January.

If you were at church over the last couple of weeks, you will remember that Ian said that we had already received very generous pledges of financial support from folk (both offers of gifts and interest free loans), which have significantly reduced the amount of money we would need to borrow on a commercial basis. Other people have very generously increased their regular giving to the church to offset the increase in monthly expenditure and help with the repayment of any loans.

We would now like to formally ask you all to consider prayerfully whether you are able to financially support this project and, if so, how much you feel God is leading you to give.
