Message from Alistair-

Up until now we have had a real mix of unsettled weather with five named storms. Storm Éowyn was one of the most exceptional storms of the decade according to the Met Office with 100mph (160km/h) winds recorded in Scotland. Strong winds and heavy rain continued soon afterwards as Storm Herminia rolled through.

I always feel sorry for the reporters who have to brave the storms and give us up-to-the minute reports on location, while we watch from the comfort of our living rooms. In the case of Storm Éowyn, when they were exposed to all the force of the wind and rain, some of the reporters had to cling to the only things that weren't moving, like a lamppost or telegraph pole!

In the same way, sometimes we're exposed to the raw force of the real world- the temptations of the world, the flesh and the devil, and the trials and tribulations of life. And maybe at those times we feel overwhelmed with what we're going through.

When that happens we're driven to cling to the Lord more closely. And we learn the same lessons that the reporters learned facing Storm Éowyn. Find the best refuge, the firmest and most unshakeable defence and hold on with all your heart, remembering that the Lord will never let you go.

Maybe today there are no great Storm Éowyns in your life. Maybe the sun is shining, the clouds are small and puffy, and the breeze is gentle. But life is unpredictable. Winds of change gust suddenly, catching us unawares. Testing times can arrive when we thought a settled week lay ahead. In a world like this, it makes sense to say close to the shelter knowing that 'God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble'- Psalm 46:1.

From George Hill - Bible Reading Week starting Sunday 16th February-

This year we are again having a church Bible Reading Week. As Christians, all of us are encouraged to put our roots deep into God's Word, the Bible. If you have attended church for some years, you will hopefully have many Bible verses (probably more than you realise) treasured in your memory.

One verse that you may know is Acts chapter 17 verse 11. The apostle Paul had been telling the Good News of Jesus to the people of Thessalonica, until some troublemakers forced him to flee. As soon as it was night, Paul left for the neighbouring town of Berea, where again he started to share the Good News of Jesus. Luke, the author of the Book of Acts, records what happened next:

'Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.' [Acts 17:11].

During our Bible Reading Week, in the warm spirit of the Bereans, we will invite you to choose and read at least one passage from the list of six Bible passages we offer you daily. Thus, on each day you will be able to choose to read any (or all!) of:

One chapter from the Gospels

One chapter from elsewhere in the New Testament

One chapter from the Old Testament

One Psalm or chapter from Proverbs

Pot pourri! Perhaps a famous or familiar passage

One entire Bible book (usually a very short one) - to be read in one go.

We'll provide the list of Bible passages for the Bible Reading Week- February 16th-22nd- nearer the time. Please watch this space for more information!

I can also record some Bible chapter readings for folks who have difficulty reading print. Please ask me.
