Message from Alistair-

Charles Wesley wrote more than 6,500 hymns. Among his more well-known hymns are 'And Can It Be', 'O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing', 'Christ the Lord Is Risen Today', 'Love Divine, All Loves Excelling', and 'Hark! The Herald Angels sing'. One of his hymns that may be slightly less well-known is 'Jesus, lover of my soul' often sung to the wonderful dark hymn tune 'Aberystwyth.'

Verse 2 of the hymn begins with a wonderful line- 'Other refuge have I none; hangs my helpless soul on Thee.' 'Refuge' is one of my favourite words. It's a word that pops up in a number of hymns and songs, and it was a favourite of King David in the Old Testament. And David uses the word 'refuge' particularly poignantly in Psalm 57.

David is on the run, being hotly pursued by Saul and hiding at the back of a cave. Trapped, lost in shadows and thought, nowhere to turn. But then he remembers he's not alone. And from the dark recesses of the cave he prays, 'Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed-' Psalm 57:1.

'Refuge' is a wonderful word, especially when we make God our refuge. Not our job, our partner, our reputation, our resources, our natural abilities, or anything else. And so make God your refuge. Let him encircle you. Let him be the foundation on which you stand. Let him be the one on whom you depend at all times and in all circumstances. And that foundation will support you, not only today and in the weeks and months to come, but on into eternity.

From Alistair and the Leadership Team- Combined SBC Special and Ordinary Church Members' Meetings on Monday 24th March 2025-

There will be a brief Special Church Members' Meeting, followed immediately by our quarterly Ordinary Church Members' Meeting, on Monday 24th March at Oasis at 7:30pm. Non-members are very welcome to attend but may not vote.

The Special Church Meeting is necessary for us to approve a single resolution required for the purchase of 36 Green Street, asking the Baptist Union Corporation Ltd to act as Holding Trustee for the property and adopt the appropriate Trust Model. Ian will explain what this means at the meeting before the vote is taken and this is a standard procedure when Baptist Churches purchase buildings and manses.

Please note that the Special Church Members' Meeting vote requires a 75% approval of the Church Members present, entitled to vote and voting.

The Ordinary Church Members' meeting will include a secret ballot to elect those new Trustees who were nominated by Sunday 9th March. They are Chris Nash and Susie Warburton.

2. The Ordinary Church Meeting financial statement.

Please attend if you can, because if this meeting is not quorate we would have to call another Special Church Meeting, which could hold up the purchase of 36 Green Street (Oasis). Thank you.
