Message from Alistair-

This Sunday is Mother's Day. And Mother's Day can be a day of mixed emotions for many of us which is perfectly understandable. I was reading about a couple whose son had just been sentenced to five years in prison. The father was deeply disappointed. He felt that in his eyes his son was a lost cause who couldn't sink much lower. The mother wept. She felt her son was a good boy who had made a mistake. She hoped that he wasn't a lost cause and still had a future.

There is often a tenderness in a mother's love that is sometimes missing from a father's. As the people of Israel were experiencing terrible suffering in exile, they needed to know that God's love has a tender side. They thought God had forsaken them. God responded by using the image of a mother nursing her infant. 'Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!' [Isaiah 49:15]. As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.' [Isaiah 66:13].

It is unthinkable to imagine a loving mother forgetting her own newborn child. It is even more unthinkable to imagine a loving God forgetting his own children.

In fact, Isaiah also reminds us of another wonderful truth- The Lord says, 'See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands.' We are engraved onto God's hands, unforgettable, always before his eyes. What a powerful reminder of God's incredible love for us, more tender than even a mother's love for her nursing baby.

From Alistair [and Eunice and Susie] - Retirement-

The Retired Baptist Minister's Housing Association has bought a house in Ettiley Heath on our behalf. The purchase was completed and contracts were exchanged a couple of weeks ago.

As far as the adaptations to the house are concerned, Social Services are due to assess Susie at the house on Friday 28th March. However, they've already said that the waiting time for a ramp is 6-12 months, and the waiting time for a wet room is 12-18 months.

And so this means unfortunately we'll have to pay for all the adaptations ourselves. Otherwise we won't be able to physically move in for up to 2 years and the house will just remain empty.

I had a long video meeting with the Housing Association on Monday. They have great links with a contractor who they use all the time to get work done on all their properties. And their contractor will be able to carry out most of the work that needs to be done- not just the adaptations like- ramps, wet rooms, grab rails etc, but also kitchen, bathroom, flooring, decorating etc.

A site meeting with the Housing Association, contractor and us has been arranged for Friday 4th April. And then when we've sorted out what needs to be done they'll carry out all the work.

The Housing Association is fairly optimistic that the contractor will be able to complete the work in a couple of months. And then we'll be able to move in. This means that as far as I'm able to say at the moment, I'll aim to retire sometime over the summer.

It goes without saying that we really value everyone's prayers as we try to get everything sorted out. Thank you very much.
