Message from Alistair-

Sometimes being alone is great. Perhaps your favourite time of the day is in the stillness and the silence, when you sense God is present, his Holy Spirit gently moving in the room and in your heart.

But our thoughts can drift to other times and to our impressions of people's aloneness – the person sitting on their own on a bench in Sandbach Park, a couple who, although together when you see them in a restaurant, seem alone in their thoughts as they wait for their meals; or the group of teenagers sitting in silence on the bus engrossed in their phones. Sometimes you can recall aloneness in a meeting at work where unity and goodwill seem to be lacking. Sometimes you can recall aloneness at home where relationships have become distant and strained and meaningful conversations have become a thing of the past.

The good news of Pentecost is that we are not alone. The Holy Spirit has been given to all God's people. Acts 2 records that there was no discrimination in who received the Holy Spirit on what we now know as 'the Day of Pentecost'. Without exception, 'all' of the 120 people waiting in an upper room in Jerusalem for what Jesus had promised, were 'filled with the Holy Spirit'.

And what happened in the room reverberated outside. The whole city was stirred. Fifty days after Jesus' resurrection, God broke into the human experience in a momentous way. Everything changed. As people asked what was going on, the Apostle Peter announced that it was the fulfilment of 'what was spoken by the prophet Joel: "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people" (Acts 2:17).

Praise be to God who acted decisively that day, once and for all time. We are not alone! The Holy Spirit is with us – the companion of our souls.
