Message from Alistair-

There was an article in 'Country Living' magazine about gratitude. And it said, 'Being grateful helps us feel positive emotions, relive happy memories, and improve our overall mental health. Even on bad days, we can find a way to dig deeper and discover something for which to be thankful.' The article also included some quotes about gratitude. For instance this one from A.A. Milne's "Winnie-the-Pooh"-

"Piglet noticed that even though he had a very small heart, it could hold a rather large amount of gratitude!"

God notices a grateful heart. And the phrase "Give thanks to the Lord" is a common call to worship and gratitude found throughout the Bible, particularly in the Psalms. And perhaps when we fail to give thanks it can affect us more than we might think.

But what about the days when we feel that everything is falling apart and the nights when we can't sleep? Are we still grateful then?

The familiar words from the Bible we often use at communion remind us that Jesus was. Paul writes, 'On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you." 1 Corinthians 11:23-24.

It's not often you see the words *betrayed* and *thanks* in the same sentence, much less in the same heart. In the midst of the darkest night of the human soul, Jesus found a time and a way to give thanks. Anyone can thank God in the light; Jesus teaches us to thank God in the night. And bear in mind that it's one thing to be grateful, but it's another thing to give thanks. Gratitude is what you feel. Thanksgiving is what you do.
