Reflection for the week

The Unknown Warrior - Andrea Jones

The grave of the Unknown Warrior in Westminster Abbey contains the remains of an unidentified British serviceman.

The story goes that on 7 November 1920, in the strictest secrecy, four unidentified British bodies were exhumed from temporary battlefield cemeteries at Ypres, Arras, the Asine and the Somme. One of the bodies was randomly selected and the other three were reburied.

The body which had been selected was placed in a specially designed oak coffin and taken by horse-drawn carriage to the quayside at Boulogne, to the sound of tolling bells and bugle calls, and from there, on the HMS Verdun, to Dover. On arrival at Dover the Unknown Warrior was given a nineteen-gun salute before a special train conveyed the coffin to London, and on the morning of 11 November 1920 it was taken to Westminster Abbey. Its final resting place.

The idea was attributed to Padre David Railton who had served on the front line during the First World War. It was his intention that the relatives of the warriors whose bodies had never been identified (who numbered over half a million) could believe that the Unknown Warrior could very well be their relative; their lost husband, son, brother, father.

As time has gone by, and more conflicts have happened, the grave has become a symbol of remembrance for all those who have lost their lives in wars and conflicts, and a symbol of gratitude and humility for their sacrifice. To this day anyone proceeding along the central aisle at Westminster Abbey has to walk around the grave so that this reminder of sacrifice is never forgotten.

May it also be a reminder that we must never cease our endeavours to spread peace and reconciliation.

From George Hill: Jerusalem & Bethlehem Slides fundraising for Albania Saturday 15 November

All are welcome to a slideshow by George Hill, who is revisiting the images from his tour of the Holy Land in 2014.

The show is free and donations will be invited towards the TEK URA ('At The Bridge') mission project in Albania, supported by Sandbach Baptist Church and directed by Dan and Annie Dupree, formerly of BMS. More on TEK URA can be found via Google or https://tekura.squarespace.com/en/who-we-are.

The slideshow will follow George and Christine's five days there, travelling through the Mount of Olives and Gethsemane; Mount Zion, Ein Karem and Emmaus; the Old City, the Via Dolorosa and the Church of the Holy Sepulchre; the Shepherd's Fields and the Church of the Nativity; Siloam, the Western Wall and the original Temple Mount steps; the Garden Tomb; Qumran, Masada and the Dead Sea; Bethany and Jericho. There is not and perhaps never will be a 'good' time to go to the Holy Land. George and Christine arrived only three weeks after the rockets stopped falling in the Second Intifada. Go if you can! But if not, this might be a good way to gain an early flavour of Christmas ...

From the Derby Healing Rooms at Costa, October 2025:

'We prayed for a lady back in November, whose sister lives in Florida. After being sole carer for her dad she was looking forward to her future and the exciting plans she had, only to be diagnosed two days after he died with advanced lung cancer and then subsequently a brain tumour. She did not have the funds for the treatment so the future looked bleak. Her sister [in England] came to us in desperation for a breakthrough.
