### From George Hill: Bible Reading Week 1-7 February 2026

Our church Bible Reading Week starts this Sunday 1 February! As Christians, all of us are encouraged to put our roots deep into God's Word, the Bible, and so we are continuing the practice we started a couple of years ago, of devoting one week to more focused Bible reading.

Jesus told the Jews: 'You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me. Yet you refuse to come to me to have life.' [John 6:39-40 (NIV)]. Let us search the Scriptures in a way the Jews did not, open to Christ's message and work in our lives. We invite you all to discover and hear for yourself what the Bible has to tell us today, by choosing each day one or more from the following selection:

- 1) One chapter from the Gospels.
- 2) One chapter from elsewhere in the New Testament.
- 3) One Old Testament chapter.
- 4) One Psalm or sometimes Proverbs chapter.
- 5) Pot Pourri! Perhaps a famous or familiar passage.
- 6) One entire short Bible book or part of a longer one - to be read all in one go.

A PDF version of the reading list for the Week will be sent out in an email today and I will have paper copies of it available at the service on Sunday for those who prefer that. Also, if anyone needs an audio MP3 version of a few chapters sent to them by Whatsapp instead, please ask me.

### **From Andrea Jones: 'Exploring the future'**

Just a reminder that, as mentioned in previous newsletters, we will be holding a series of 'Exploring the future' meetings, led Rev Neil Brighton (a Transitional Minister with the NWBA) to help us all think about where we are as a church and the things which will be important as we start the process to look for a new minister. These are the dates ... and there will be cake (☺) ... so please do put them on your calendar if you haven't already:

#### **Saturday 14 February 10:00am – 12:00noon at Oasis**

##### **Session One: How are we doing?**

Our first session together will reflect on how we are doing as a fellowship. A healthy church is one that reflects the character and mission of Christ in its worship, community and witness. Our session will explore how we live by faith, live as a community and look to draw others in.

#### **Sunday 22 March 2:30pm – 4:30pm at Oasis**

##### **Session Two: What are our values?**

Our second session will look at the things we value as a church. Those things which give our church its character and vibe. As part of the discussion we will try and identify some key priorities for the future.

## **Monday 30 April 7:00pm – 9:00pm at Oasis**

### **Session Three: What sort of ministry?**

Our third session will dig into the question of what sort of minister(s) might the church need for the future? Partly to identify the core strengths a future minister will need, but also to ask questions about how we balance the need for a pastor, with our desire to reach the community and grow our work with young people.

### **From Andrea Jones: Prayer Days to support our 'Exploring the future'**

As you know, we are planning to wrap the 'Exploring the future' meetings with a season of focused prayer sessions to fully seek God's direction for us. We held the first one at Oasis on 17 January, and the theme which emerged from that one was that we were a 'building site' and not a 'museum' – a church which had a heart to keep moving forward with God. A couple of us saw the church as a (moving) circle which was a gathering of God's people for worship and communion with Jesus, so that we could then radiate the love of Jesus outwards to the community. It was a lovely time and we would encourage everyone to try to join one of the sessions if you are able. The next one will be on 8 February, and we have now added two more which will be on 11 April and 9 May:

### **Saturday 11 April 9.30-11.30am (ish) Prayer Walk**

This will be an opportunity to pray more broadly for our place in the town (physically and spiritually). We will gather at Oasis after the usual morning prayer gathering, and then we will spend an hour walking (in 1's or 2's) around the streets surrounding Oasis (as we each feel led) praying silently for the areas we pass, the people who live and work there, the town generally etc. We will then reassemble at Oasis around 10:30am for some refreshments and to share anything which we feel has been revealed to us.

### **Saturday 9 May 2:00-4:00pm Time of Quiet and Shared Prayer at Oasis**

This will be a meditative style of prayer at Oasis which will be a further chance to reflect and pray about our future. This will be a mix of quiet personal prayer interspersed with shared prayer slots every half hour, much as we did on 17 January.
